The type and amount of the award is based on information reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and a formula devised by the U.S. Department of Education to calculate unmet need. Information on the Disbursement of Aid- The school processes eligible disbursements of federal financial aid by crediting directly to the student's account with the school. Federally funded aid includes Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Subsidized and Unsubsidized Direct Loans, and Parent PLUS Direct Loans. Non-federal funding may include state, military, institutional, and private funding. Non-federal funds may, or may not, be credited directly to your account.

General Conditions and Terms Applicable to Employment provided as part of the Financial Aid Package-the Federal Work Study Program provides an opportunity for our students to earn money from part-time employment while attending classes. FWS positions are paid an hourly wage and are located both on and off campus, with an approved off-campus community organization. Federal Work Study is a need-based type of financial aid and eligibility is determined by the information the student provides on their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). In order to apply, a student must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress and remain in good standing with the campus.
